Update on PAC News

A message from the PAC President.

When my oldest daughter started here I didn't know how the PAC contributed to the learning experience for my own child so I thought maybe I could tell you exactly what the PAC does.

At the beginning of the year parents meet and we decide on a budget for planned activities and additional requests that come in to us. This year the budget is set at approximately \$37,000. We use these funds for things such as classroom supplies, field trips, fine arts performers and the art show.

We have a variety of ways that this funding is achieved; some of the larger fundraisers are hot lunch, spring fair and art cards; in addition this year we have decided on more family centric fundraisers such as movie nights and family dances to bring teachers, students and parents together and build a sense of community.

Without parent volunteer support, programs are not possible and the students will not have the additional support and extracurricular events. If you are interested in coming out to a PAC meeting; they are the second Thursday of every month. We are still in need of volunteers. The meetings are a great place to connect with other families and support ongoing PAC initiatives. The more you engage with the school community, the more rewarding your experience will be.
